

Taking Command of CUNY+/Aleph500, Part 1:

Using Aleph's Common Command Language (CCL) to gather statistical counts on library resources by format, collection, sub-library, etc. (excluding volume/item count); Doing some Collection assessment and troubleshooting

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Aleph Common Command Language (CCL) can be use either in the Public Catalog (Web OPAC) or the staff GUI OPAC. I recommend that you restrict statistical searches to your local/base catalog.

Records that have a status of SUPPRESSED and/or DELETED will and should not appear in your results.

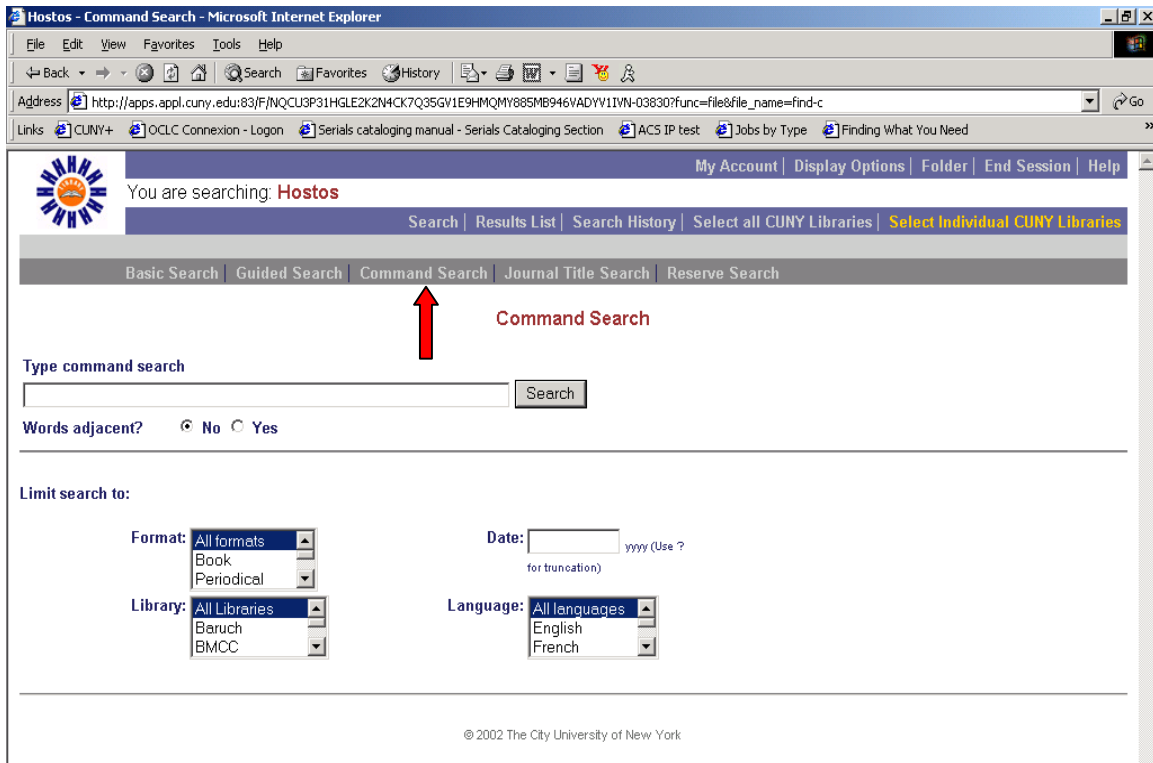
The CCL abbreviations are used to search specific fields in CUNY+/Aleph records for controlled codes, numbers or regular words in fields (regular words are not need for statistics unless you wanted to very specific, for example on particular subject).

CCL abbreviations can also be combined using Boolean logic (i.e., "and" "or" "not").

Note: WSL (sub-library), WOW (OWN), and WCL (Collection) are unique for your library and the examples provided below are unique for Hostos Community College. In many cases, collection codes are similar among the various colleges.

Note: Some of your search results will not be sort and in some case you will be able to sort by title, etc. (I believe results that are not sorted are arranged in record number order?)

Note: When searching CCL in the Web OPAC, Ignore the search limits at the bottom of the screen.



CCL Abbreviations

The following CCL abbreviations can be used for gathering statistical counts.

WOW= to search by OWN field (see appendix for full list)

- HO** Hostos Community College
- CC** City College
- BX** Bronx Community College
- AL** All CUNY Libraries (records are scoped to all local catalogs/bases)

Example: WOW=HO AND WFM=BK to search for book format own by Hostos.

Note: if WOW is not included, your search will also retrieve AL (CUNY) resources. Another example of this search in your local catalog (Web or GUI) is

WFM=BK not WOW=AL

WSL= to search by Sub-Library (see appendix for full list)

HO001 Hostos
HORSV Hostos Reserve
CC001 City College

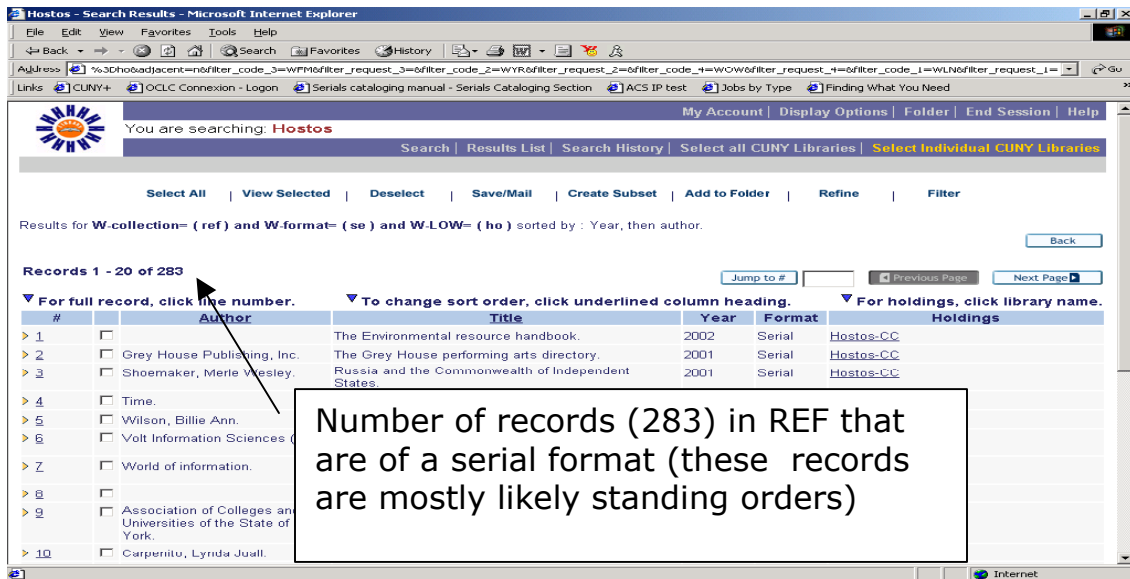
Example: WSL=HORSV to search for and display all titles on Reserve.

Note1: If a Sub-Library was change temporarily, the record will not be displayed under that sub-library. For example, an item was taken from the stacks and then placed on reserve (the temporary location box should be checked off). This may also apply to collections.

WCL= to search by Collection

REF Reference
PER Periodicals
STACK Stacks
RESE Reserve
JUV Juvenile Collection

Example: WCL=REF AND WFM=SE AND WOW=HO to search for Reference resources in the Reference Collection that are in a book (bk) format and are own by Hostos.



In this search, for example, I can assess the currency of the items attached each of these records. The year column does not necessarily reflect the currency because these are serial records and the date/year is based on the opening/starting date of the publication

WFM= to search by format

BK books
CF computer file
MP maps
MU music
SE serials
VM visual materials
MS mixed materials

Example: WFM=se AND WOW=HO to search for a Serial format records owned by Hostos.

WFS= to search by secondary format

WFS points to marc tag 006, which contains the code for secondary format codes/characteristics. This would include for example, a serial that is electronic (i.e., computer file). In addition, this also includes materials that are accompanied by resources in another format such as a book with a CD-ROM or Diskette.

e Cartographic material
f Manuscript cartographic material
c Printed music
d Manuscript music

Example: WFS=m AND WFM=se not WOW=AL to search for a Serial formats that are also in electronic/computer file secondary format and not owned by AL (i.e., CUNY Resource)

WYR= to search by Year of Publication

WYR searches 008 Date 1 and 260 Sub-field c

Example: **WYR=2001**

Example: **WYR=200? or 1999**

WLN= to search by Language

eng English
fre French
heb Hebrew
ita Italian
spa Spanish

Example: **wln=spa and wyr=200? and wow=ho**

Other CCL abbreviations you can use for statistics

Call Numbers

LOC (LC Call number) or
SHL (LC Shelf List) or
PST (All Call numbers)
OTH (Other Call numbers) 852 8_
SUD (SuDOC)

LOC, SHL and PST appears to be equivalent.

Example: **LOC=QA76.5 and WCL=REF**

Example: **LOC=QA76? and WCL=REF**

Note: Call numbers works well with ? after the call number.

Note: RT41 (will find any item with just RT41) and RT41? Will find all RT41s

Subjects

SUB (Subject Browse)

WSU (Subject Keyword)

For additional CCL abbreviations, use the help screen on CUNY+ Web OPAC

Boolean Searching

You may use the Boolean operators AND, OR, and NOT in your search string. In addition, more than one operator may appear in the search string. For example, you could type **WFS=m AND WFM=se not WOW=AL** to search for a Serial formats that are also in electronic/computer file secondary format and not owned by AL (i.e., CUNY Resources available to all libraries)

AND indicates that all terms must be in a record.

OR indicates that any of the terms may be present.

NOT indicates that one or more terms should be excluded.

Whenever you use **OR** with either **AND** or **NOT** or both that you must place the terms joined by **OR** in parentheses.

wyr=(199? or 2000)

Filter Options

- New items (added within the last 60 days)
- Created since date
- Range of years item was created

Truncation

Either the question mark (?) or the asterisk (*) may be used to retrieve results for several forms of a word or number. For example, *200?* will find records containing *2000, 2001, 2002, and 2003, etc.*

wyr=(199? or 2000)

Cross searching with sets

Collection Development

CCL abbreviations are excellent for collection development purposes. Collection Development librarians, subject bibliographers, or liaisons to departments can browse the entire collection or a specific collection (e.g., REF) to see how many titles in a particular subject area or as well as evaluate the currency of the items

For examples:

WOW=HO and WCL=REF and WSU=Nursing

If you want to search by call number, I recommend doing a Basic Search.

Comparative studies: I wanted to see what NYC Tech. has in its collection on the subject of Radiologic technology compared with Hostos.

WOW=(HO or NY) and WSU=Radiologic Technology.

Troubleshooting

Troubleshooting can be done in the local/base or union cataloging depending on the information you would like to find.

For example, you would like to find out if your staff attached holdings/items to another school. Your search must be done in the Union catalog.

I wanted to find holdings that are QC but are not owned by QC, it must be searched the union catalog.

wsl = (qc001) not wow = (qc)

Another example, I wanted to find all records that do not have a holdings and perhaps no items (I call these floating records), I would do a search in the Hostos catalog to exclude all my collection codes

wow=ho not wcl=stack not wcl=juv not wcl=per not wcl=ref not wcl=av not wcl=arch not wcl=rese
